

2020 CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES REGULATIONS AND SCORING.

OVERVIEW

THE CAMS State Speed Event Series (SSES) is designed to encourage competition for all ages and improve the skill level of competitors. The only requirements are for the Driver to be a member of a CAMS affiliated club, hold a minimum of a Level 2S CAMS competition licence and compete in a vehicle which complies with the General Requirements for Cars and Drivers, Schedules A and B. This is a friendly competition designed to improve driver skill and vehicle performance whilst determining the best and most consistent competitor. We thank our promoters and sponsors for their contributions; they are WASCC, MSW, Rally WA, GSSMA, LF Performance.

Authority

The events shall be conducted under the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, the National Competition Rules of CAMS, these Regulations, Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations that may be issued by the promoters.

Series Registration

Registration for the 2020 season is \$99.00 Inc GST and can be completed here on the CAMS online registration page. [CHAMPIONSHIP REGISTRATION](#)

Fees are held by CAMS in a managed trust fund. Funds are used to purchase Event and Season Trophies or Awards and for general administration of the Series. Registration for the Series entitles the competitor to;

- Notification of entries
- Earn Series points
- Be awarded event trophies & end of season series trophies
- A competition number allocated for the season
- Vehicle Decals with Registered Number (once only at first registration)
- Access to the Targeted Vehicle Scrutineering System

Non series registered competitors are not entitled to series points or event trophies.

Each event organiser will issue Entry Forms and Supplementary Regulations that will be read in conjunction with these Conditions. Registered competitors will receive an email notification of event entries.

Competitors will be provided one set (2) of decals with their allocated number as part of their initial registration. Replacement decals can be ordered at additional cost.

Competition Number 1 is reserved for the previous year's Series Champion. Competitors can register at any time during the season for the Series competition and will accrue points after registration.

Points, Trophies & Awards

The CAMS Western Australian Speed Event Champion of the Year shall be the competitor with the highest overall points at the end of the season. Series points can be earned in all championship rounds of the 2020 season.

For the 2020 season, all championship rounds count towards the total points score. This is to reward maximum participation and reward vehicle reliability.

Point scores are accumulated according to the table below:

Double Points Rounds

The two rounds that are scheduled to take place in Albany mid-year will earn double the prescribed points outlined above for the 2020 season.

A Trophy for Season Overall Champion will be presented at the CAMS WA awards ceremony to be scheduled at the end of the season. Trophies for class winners and others will be presented at the SSES presentation event post season.

Series organisers will award event trophies to NCR Classes which have more than three entries at an event.

In the event of less than 3 entries at an event in a class, no trophy will be awarded, but the entries are entitled to SSES championship points. When there are at least 3 entries in a class at an event, 1st place trophy will be awarded. When there are at least 5 entries in a class at an event, 2nd place trophy will be awarded. When there are at least 8 entries in a class at an event, 3rd place trophy will also be awarded.

An NCR class needs to have at least 3 competitors that ran within it during the season before a trophy will be awarded at the end of season. When there are at least 5 competitors that ran in a class during the season, 2nd place trophy will be awarded. When there are at least 8 competitors that ran in a class during the season, 3rd place trophy will also be awarded.

An NCR class that is orphaned (i.e. a class which has less than the minimum of 3 competitors all season) may be combined with other compatible orphaned class(es) at the end of the season in order to come up with a combined class winner. An orphaned class would not be combined with a viable NCR class. 2wd and 4wd classes may be combined if required. The competitor with the highest overall/outright series points earned from a particular class is the winner of a combined class (class points would not be used in the determination of the winner in this case). If the overall/outright points method fails to determine the winner, highest place finishes in each round will be used to determine the winner.

A competitor may enter 2 cars per event, however he/she may only be awarded one lot of overall points (the higher scoring lot of the 2) and one lot of class points (the higher scoring lot of the 2) if both cars entered are in the same class. A vehicle may only be nominated to be in one class per event. A registered competitor is able to score class points across different classes during the season as well as at an event.

Where multiple competitors are tied on points (both end of year class points tally and overall/outright points tally) at the end of the season, the tie shall be settled by count-back based on the highest place finishes in each round.

Vehicle Scrutiny

Vehicles must be presented for inspection by a series scrutineer before being allowed to compete unless registered in the CAMS Targeted Scrutiny System.

Vehicle Class Declaration

All competitors are required to declare a National Speed Event Championship class listed under the Class Structure section of this document for their entries at SES events hosted by various host clubs.

If the SES championship classes are not listed on the CAMS online portal or manual entry form (if offered) for an event, registered competitors would need to declare their classes formally to the SES organisers before the start of competition of an event if they wish to score Series class points. This could be done by way of emailing the SES organisers before the event, or filling out a manual form on the day prior to the start of competition.

The SSES team is there to assist with the class information if needed. If no class is nominated on the event entry form prior to the event or the class nominated isn't an acceptable class listed under Class Structure in this document, or the class chosen is clearly inappropriate for the vehicle, the SSES will classify the vehicle as it sees fit based on the information available. It is the competitor's responsibility to select the right class under the National Speed Events (incl. Sprint and Hillclimb) list with pulldown menu selection within the CAMS Event Entry (CEE) online portal's My Car section where the competitor can declare the appropriate NCR class. In the case of manual entry with a hosting club, a full description of the class is required under the " class " field.

If a competitor does not agree with a class the SES organising team has decided for him/her, he/she may elect to be in another NCR class but it must be formally declared. If a competitor does not agree with the series' decision of an appropriate class for whatever reason yet is unwilling to choose an NCR class, the entry will not be classed, i.e. treated as unclassified and would not be eligible for class points.

Efforts will be made from the SES team to contact competitors via email addresses provided by the host club to seek information on vehicles that are not on the SES database. If a competitor does not respond with sufficient information regarding car specifications and modifications and the competitor is unable or unwilling to declare an acceptable class listed in this document before the commencement of an event, the vehicle will be deemed as unclassified.

Capacity Break(s) of an NCR class

When at least 3 of each cc break have competed during the season, a capacity break will be formed within that class. The cc break chosen will fall between the cc breaks within that NCR class regulations.

Class(es) with cc break(s) from the previous season will be carried over onto the current season with the break(s) intact. For example 3D sport sedan class will have an under and over 2L break at the start of the 2020 season. Should this class fail to have at least 3 cars under 2L and 3 cars over 2L at the end of the 2020 season, the class would be merged as 3D class without any cc break within and the class results would be recompiled by the series scorer when the break is removed.

Apparel

All competitors must comply with Schedule D 2.4 in the CAMS Manual.

Vehicle Classification

Entry to the series is available to all CAMS vehicle classes, including rally, drift and time attack vehicles. Competitors should determine which CAMS Category, Group and Class their car is compliant to when

making the vehicle eligibility statement on their entry form. Competitors are reminded of the penalties applicable when entering a vehicle that is not compliant with the regulations. The onus of compliance lies with the entrant.

If a vehicle is modified beyond the NCR class specification, it is advisable for the entrant to state this on the entry form using the prefix "MODIFIED" to indicate to the organisers that the vehicle is not compliant to the category, NCR class or regulations.

Modified vehicles will be classified into classes with similar performance.

Competitors will be advised of classification prior to competition.

Non purely Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) powered vehicles

Vehicles such Hydrogen powered vehicles, Hybrid powered (i.e. ICE+battery) vehicles and Electric Vehicles (EV) will be classified within a propulsion break of its own, separate from the other purely ICE vehicles and will not be combined with other purely ICE powered vehicles in terms of scoring and awards. For example a Tesla 4wd EV sedan entered as a 3C rally car 4wd will be placed in a subclass of 3C rally car 4wd (Hydrogen/Hybrid/EV).

Vehicles with alternate forms of drive such as electric, hydrogen powered or hybrid engines will require an application be made to the series coordinator(s) prior to registration. This is to allow organisers forewarning to classify the vehicles and determine any alternate safety requirements for these vehicles.

In the event of a vehicle being modified beyond what is allowed in the nominated NCR class during the championship season, the vehicle will migrate to its new class and no longer be eligible to score points in the previous class.

Class Structure

For 2020 SES season, the number of NCR classes available for competitors is based on the CAMS National Speed Event Championship Classes, with the classes available listed as per below (classes not included in this list will not be accepted):

Additional notes:

Cars that comply with Tarmac Rally classes are most likely to also comply with 3C Rally car classes

3D sports sedan has a maximum cc limit of 6000cc

Time Attack Clubsprint Classes require the use of a passenger road tyre, i.e. not Semi Slicks. Check CAMS approved Time Attack class regs for details.

If a competitor has a vehicle built for an NCR class that is not on the list above, he/she has to declare a class that the vehicle complies with, e.g. if one has an 3E Excel Cup car, it would most likely comply with either 3J IPRA or 3D sports sedan or even 3C rally cars 2wd. The Onus is on the competitor to read through the CAMS NCR class requirements and choose carefully.

2B/2F class will be split into 2B and 2F classes provided there are at least 3 of each, i.e. 3 qty 2B vehicle and 3 qty 2F vehicles at events. For the 2020 season 2B and 2F will be scored seperately on the championship class tally as carried over from the previous season. Should there be less than 3 qty of 2B and 3 qty of 2F vehicles on the tally table at the end of the season they will be combined as 2B/2F for the season and the Series Scorer shall recompile results to reflect the amalgamation.

Vehicle Suitability

The onus is on the competitor to ensure the vehicle is suitable for the event. I.e. not all events take place on a perfectly smooth racing surface. Some courses may comprise closed public roads, car parking lots, access roads etc.

Vehicles with limited suspension travel, low clearance due to low ride height and/or fitted with splitters/aprons/skirts/diffusers may have issues at certain events.

Check with the promoter (i.e. hosting club) of event prior to entering regarding track/course layout and characteristics.

Unusual types of vehicle may need approval from promoter before entering, e.g. off road buggy. The promoter of the event decides if a vehicle is acceptable or not.

Likewise, competitors entering vehicles not fitted with working headlamps and/or tail lamps need to consult the promoter in the case of twilight/night events where competition takes place post daylight hours.

Car numbers

SES Competitors' car numbers will be carried over from the 2018 season. Those allocated SES car numbers will be kept for SES competitors who are yet to be registered until the 3rd round of the season. Post 3rd round any unallocated numbers will be made available for reallocation again.

Sportsmanship

Competitors are reminded of the provisions contained within the regulations governing the sport. Penalties may apply for poor sportsmanship or behaviour. All competitors have protections and rights to protest, these should be directed to the Stewards of a meeting. Members of CAMS also need to be mindful of their public comments posted on social media which could affect the Sport in a negative way and guidelines for what is acceptable is covered under the CAMS social media policy.
